Revision of Laboratory T&C's

Renewable Energy Assurance Limited (REAL) has a set of terms and conditions (T&C's) for laboratories appointed to undertake testing under the Compost Certification Scheme. The third version of the T&C's were published in January of 2019; T&C's are reviewed on an annual basis. The latest version of the T&C's has been revised to combine the CCS and BCS terms and conditions for appointed laboratories. Formally, the CCS/BCS terms and conditions were two separate documents. The third version of the T&C's has been reviewed and agreed by the Approved Laboratories.

Independent Laboratory Audits Summary Report

The fourth round of independent audits was carried out during summer/autumn of 2018. The audit process and outcome has been summarised in the 2018 Independent Audits report, available [here](#).

Similar to the consolidation of the Laboratory T&C's, from January 2019 the Compost Certification Scheme laboratory audits will be combined with the Biofertiliser Certification Scheme laboratory audits. This will make the auditing process more efficient for laboratories approved to both schemes. For REAL, this has freed up resource to look into the development of a proficiency testing programme for tests specific to the two schemes. This will provide a number of benefits to include: supporting the auditing process, improved measurement accuracy and providing greater year round laboratory performance monitoring.
